Mission

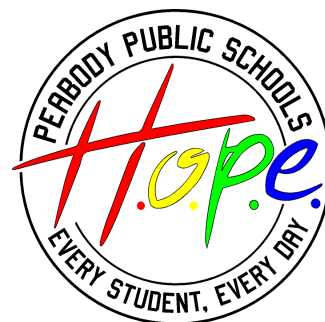
